

Minutes: Approved as printed in the November 2008 Lithogram.

Treasurer's Report: Deloris Colonna itemized income and outgo since the previous report. All Lithorama dealers have paid. Speaker Glenn Lehrer has been paid, as has **Bill Beiriger** for purchase of the digital projector used at Mr. Lehrer's presentation. The current balance is \$11, 651.50.

CFMS: Bob Whiteside reported on the meeting he attended at Visalia.

- The 2009 CFMS show will be April 17 19, 2009 at the Santa Clara County Fairgrounds.
- Camp Paradise will be o May 17, 2009. The camp activities at Zzyzx will be in the fall of next year.
- A vote was taken to raise CFMS dues from \$1.50 to \$2.00 per person. Insurance is extra.
- The AFMS is considering adding a beading category for competition.
- Rockhounds are upset about land use restrictions. Many areas in the California desert will be accessible only on horseback or hiking. Discussions continue. The American Land Access Association (ALAA) has been established. Bill B. will post information on the club website.

MEETING PLACE: Calico Road on the north side of the 15 Freeway.

ROAD CONDITIONS: This is for a 4-wheel drive vehicle only! Some sand and steep canyon grades are expected. No 2-wheel drive or low-clearance vehicles. You may need to get a ride with a friend with a 4-wheel drive.

ACCOMMODATIONS: If you choose to stay overnight, there is nice camping in Mule Canyon (dry camping only) or you may stay in Barstow (there are several motels). Motel 6 allows pets. Food, water and gas are also available in Barstow.

MATERIAL TO COLLECT: Palm wood, Silver Lace Agate and (our primary objective) Sagenite. Sagenite in this area is not overly-abundant, so don't expect to fill your sack. You must dig for the best material. It is great agate and you must work to obtain a small amount; however, when you find a good one, it makes all your hard work worth it! This is a remote area, so please bring extra water, packed lunch and supplies.

NOTES: The desert can be very cold at night. Bring extra jackets and blankets if you plan to camp out. Don't forget your camera. Calico is well-known for it's geological scenery.

Please help protect our deserts and pack-out what you packed-in!

All those attend the collecting trips will be required to fill out a Liability Waiver form.

These were friends of **Shana Scott** [and **Rich** and **Gayla Langlois'** grandson **Nick Angelo**]. **Beth Myers** moved that the Lithophiles show their appreciation with gift certificate for ice cream, movies or other appropriate token. Approved.

Lithorama Report (Bill Beiriger):

Lower attendance then last year, but people stayed longer. Dealers did well and were happy. Fewer adults on Sunday, but more kids. The silent auction/sale brought in \$1,535.00 for the two days, and the sale of **Mike Gorges'** microscope, portable uv lamp and microscope brought in \$421.00. Bill **B**. thanked everyone for their help, especially **Gayla Langlois** for her work in the kitchen.

Schools (Bill Beiriger):

- Seven out of ten schools with 4th graders participated in the crystal growing. Bill B. will make-up certificates. He would like to see \$400 - 500.00 donated [to the science department]. Some discussion followed regarding what the schools were purchasing. Teachers expressed interest in books, videotapes and fossil samples.
