WORKSHOPS:


- Feb. 15 at Nancy Bankheads, Fimo Clay Beads. Call Nancy or Beth Myers.

Rich Hunt and I (your editor) were talking at breakfast one weekend and Rich suggested that I do a series of articles on sand. I will start the series with this issue of the Lithogram.

Sand of the Month

Quartz Sand William Beiriger

The sand this month will be the most common of sands and sandstone, those composed primarily of quartz.

Most of continental ocean beaches and also the sands of large dune structures, rivers and lakes are composed of quartz sand. These sands can range in color from white, light tan, pink, orange to dark reds and browns. Most sands that are colored have coatings due to the presents of mainly oxides, in the case of reds, browns and oranges the oxide is iron. Most of the colors are adhered to the surface of the sand particles but can also be internally bound in the crystal.

Some of these quartz sands are very white and are very pure 99.5% silica with a formula of SiO₂.

The best high purity sands in the United States come from the St. Peter Sandstones ranging from Minnesota to Missouri and from Illinois into Nebraska. A very large deposit of this sand is found at Ottawa, Illinois; the sand from that location has been given the name Ottawa Sand.

The St. Peter sands were formed in shallow lakes during the Ordovician Period (450 -500 myo).

Another important location is at Ione, California. This deposit is much more recent having an age from the Eocene Period (35-55 myo). This area extends for more than 200 mile along the western side of the Sierra Nevada Mountains.

The St. Peter sands are important for the glass industry and were used by Henry Ford for making windshields and headlights for his early cars. Other uses are: for sand casting of foundry parts, for abrasive sandpaper and the production of silicon carbide abrasives, and it is also used for making ceramics. In the oil and gas industry high quality sand is used to keep the fractures in the country rock open so that oil and gas can be extracted more easily. Large quantities of high purity silica sand are used for making the silicon for computer chips and solar cells.


Lower quality silica sands are used in making concrete and for other uses in building products.
