### **State Fossils**

### **Oklahoma & Utah State Fossils**

**Saurophaganax maximus,** it is the State Fossil for Oklahoma, it is from the Late Jurassic Epoch, from 157 to 152 million years ago, it is from part of the Morrison Formation. Only partial remains of this dinosaur have been found. The name means "Lizard Eating Master."

Saurophaganax was about 40 feet long. It became the State Fossil in 2000

**Allosaurus fragilis**, is the State Fossil for Utah, and was found in the same geologic formation as the larger **Saurophagnax**; some scientists argue that there isn't enough fossil material of **Saurophaganax** to differentiate between **Saurophaganax** and **Allosaurus**. It lived during the same time period as **Saurophaganax**. The name means "Different Lizard."



**Allosaurus** was the smaller of the two dinosaurs and may have replaced the larger dinosaur because of a dwindling food supply, it was only about 28 feet long. It became the State Fossil in 1988.

The fossil is an **Allosaurus** from the Houston Natural History Museum. The painting is Saurophaganax.
