President's Message: Summertime


VERMORE VALLEY

State Fossils

Connecticut & Massachusetts State Fossil

Eubrontes giganteus, dinosaur tracks were first found at Greenfield, Massachusetts in the Connecticut Valley in 1836 then a second find was made in Rocky Hill, Connecticut in 1966.

They are Late Triassic and Early Jurassic in age, 227 – 180 million years old.

First discovered in 1802 in South Hadley, Massachusetts, they were thought to be from a threetoed bird. Later it was decided they were from a dinosaur, first they were thought to be from a herbivore, but in 1953 it was changed to a carnivorous theropod. The footprint remains were found in North America before any dinosaurs were ever found.

Dinosaur footprints are called Ichnites, they are a Trace Fossil; they never livered but were made by a living animal. Other trace fossils include; gastroliths (gizzard stones), Coprolites (dung), and nests.

Ichnites can tell us a lot about the lives of the animals that made them. We can learn about their foot size, the length of their stride, if they were running or walking, were there more then one type of dinosaur present and did they have their young with them.

Connecticut adopted Ichnites in 1991

Massachusetts adopted Ichnites in 1980

The Connecticut and Massachusetts track fields contained two major dinosaur groups, *Eubrontes* and *Anchisauripus*.



Rich and Chris Hunt presented Machu Picchu and the Galapagos Islands where they had traveled in April.


