
State Fossils

Texas State Fossil

Paluxysaurus jonesi, This is one of the sauropod dinosaurs, which are members of a group of herbivorous. It is named for the town of Paluxy in Hood County, Texas, where the bones and footprints are found scattered over the ground on the Jones Ranch. Early on they had the State Fossil listed as *Pleurocoelus nanus* and then choose *Paluxysaurus jonesi*, both are found in Texas.

It is from the Late Jurassic Epoch from about 112 to 95 million years ago and it is found in the Twin Mountains Formation. It was about 12 feet high at shoulder and 70 feet in length with long neck that was 26 feet in length and weighted in at 40,000 pounds.

mentioned in the President's Message, the 600 Grit Diamond (see photo) has already been damaged and will fail soon. Care is not being taken in the use of Shop equipment. Stephanie Goldsmith suggested we buy a second pixie. A new unit costs about \$1700 and would be used for outreach events. The slab saws are running and we're making slabs for sale at Lithorama.

We need to plan a Clean-Up Party for the Shop and the storage area. If the foreman is all alone in the Shop, he/she cannot do any work for safety reasons.

Alameda County Fair

Bill Beiriger talked with Maureen Bankhead about having a demonstration table for a couple of hours several days during the Fair; she will get back to him. Norm Hodgson from Castro Valley Society is helping her with this part of the Hobby Building. Bill is disappointed that none of our members volunteered to put up a display at the fair. Members of Castro Valley Society are putting up 14 displays. That is one reason they get new members and we do not.

Shop

We need to replace several diamond wheels. Care is not being taken in the use of shop equipment. Bill Beiriger will order a new set of drive belts of the Pixie unit. The old ones did not break, but have dried out and have lost their flexibility.

Lithorama
