Members, Lithorama will be on November 21st and 22nd with Set-Up on the 20th. We need your help for set-up starting at 8:30 of Friday.

Set-up includes getting everything down from the storage area at the BARN and setting up case stands, tables. We then must put the blue skirts on the tables and set-up the cases. On Saturday before the SHOW starts we must set-up several pop-ups outside alongside the BARN on the South side. We will have a Gold Panning Demonstration table, a Polished Stone Panning area for the children and this year Food will be served alongside the BARN on the Southside with tables for earting in the normal area in the back room of the BARN.

A major NEW part of the set-up is we must start cooking some of the FOOD at the BARN. By law we CAN NOT cook food at our homes, so that puts extra work on the kitchen help, Connie Gouveia has voluntered the chair the food for the show. School Report Bill Beiriger

I have given a few presentations since school resumed this year.

I was part of a team presentation for Moon Day at St. Michaels' School. I have worked with Sridhar Ramanathan when he was involved with the Scouts at St. Michaels; so he was doing a program on the Moon Phases and he asked me to do a section on Moon Rocks.

So, I put together a collection of volcanic rocks and brought them into the classroom. The first question I had for the students was, "Do you think I am going to show you some Moon Rocks", well they were a little disappointed when they learned I did not have any. As, I informed them if I had Moon Rocks I could be sent to jail and fined a lot of money. I then told them that no individual can own Moon Rocks. I did tell them that I had a chance to work on Apollo 11 Moon Rocks at LLNL as sample prep for work that Dr. Iris Borg worked on for NASA.

I did show them a collection of Earth volcanic rocks and gave a comparison of how they compared with volcanic rocks from the Moon.

The next school I gave a presentation at was Valley View Elementary School in Pleasanton. The presentation was to 120 Second Graders as one large group. The secession went well even though there were times when they got a little noise, but that must be expected with so many young students. We had a very good question and answer section at the end of the presentation.

I have enjoyed going to Valley View School over a period of many years.

After the beginning of the New Year 2016, I am already on the calendar for several schools.

I will also take part in Science Odyssey in February.

Yesnaby by Jenny Siders

We spent 10 days in Scotland in October, most of them in the Orkney Islands off the northern coast of Scotland. We saw a number of interesting rocks and fossils.

This photo is of stromatolites at Yesnaby on the coast of Orkney, the largest of the Orkney Islands. Stromatolites are the fossilized remains of bluegreen algae which grew here 400 million years ago when the area was a great lake called Lake Orcadie and was south of the equator!





This is the coastline is where we saw the stromatollites, up on the cliff tops. The alternating layers of dark bands (which formed in deep, still water) and lighter bands (formed in more turbulent shallows) suggest that the layer of the lake fluctuated over time. The buildings on the top of the cliffs were part of the Yesnaby Gun battery during WWII.
