## **Lithophiles Mineral** of the Month

### Lee Davisson

Uvarovite is a member of the garnet family with a composition of calcium chromium silicate. Not surprising it is typically found in chromium mines as small wellformed green crystals. It was discovered in 1832 and named after Count Uvarov, a Russian statesman and amateur collector. Almost all garnets are found in metamorphic rocks with uvarovite particularly associated with metamorphosed limestones or in chromium rich serpentine deposits. The type local is the Saranovskii



Mine in Sarany, in the Ural Mountains of Russia. Crystals tend to be only a few millimeters in diameter but form large cluster arrays on a groundmass. Other well-known mines are in Finland, Italy, and Turkey, but also small occurrences in the chromite mines near Livermore. The small crystal size of uvarovite prevents use as a faceting gemstone, but there are very small crystalline varieties that have been shaped into cabochons.

# **State Fossils**

## Idaho State Fossil

**Equus simplicidens**, The Hagerman Horse. The horse lived in the Late-Pliocene Epoch 3.5 million years ago. It was discovered in 1928 and became the Idaho State Fossil in 1988. *Simplicidens* is the oldest known representative of the modern horse genus, but it is more closely related to Grevy's Zebra of Africa then to horses, so it is called the American Zebra.

It is from the Hagerman Fossil Beds, which are the richest Late Pliocene fossil deposits in the world. The Hagerman Valley was created 15,000 years ago during the Bonneville Flood. The flood cut into the ground and created 600-foot cliffs on the Snake River.

The horse was between 43 & 57 inches at the shoulder and weighed between 385 & 847 pounds.

It became extent along with all other horses about 10,000 years ago at the end of the Ice Age. The modern day horses that live in North America; were brought here by the early explorers that came here from Europe.

*E. Simplicidens* is found in Mexico and most of the United States: it was first found by E. D. Cope who identified the species from Llano Estacado, Mount Blanco area of Texas in 1892.
